Luca Chittaro is full professor of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) in the Department of Mathematics, Computer Science, and Physics of the University of Udine, where he heads the HCI Laboratory (<http://hclab.uniud.it>), which he founded in 1998.

His major research interests are in the area of human-computer interaction, particularly in virtual reality, training systems, mobile devices, persuasive technology, and their applications in health and safety. He has authored or co-authored over 180 academic publications, and he is an ACM Distinguished Speaker.

He has designed innovative software applications for Aviation Safety Education, Emergency Medical Services, and Fire Safety. His recently released aviation safety apps have received great attention from the public and the media. As of September 2016, they have been installed by more than 550'000 users in total.

He has received research grants from a wide range of organizations, including the European Union (EU), the US Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), the Italian Ministry of University and Research (MIUR), and international companies such as the Benetton Group and the Intesa Sanpaolo Bank Group.
