

GILLES MORIN's biography

Gilles Morin is the Chief of Aircraft Certification Standards in the Standards Branch of Transport Canada Civil Aviation.

Prior to this current position, from 2001 to 2006, he was the Manager of Domestic Regulations, Regulatory standards, Aircraft Certification branch.

Gilles worked over 19 years with the Department of National Defence (DND) as the Deputy Aircraft Engineering Officer for the Airbus A310 fleet, and held various engineering positions in major projects, including the Project Management Office for the Electronic Support and Training Systems on Challenger aircraft, the Hercules Avionics Update and the Coastal Patrol Aircraft as an Electromagnetic Environmental Effects engineer specializing in Electromagnetic Interference/Compatibility, Electromagnetic Pulse, Electrostatic Discharge and lightning.

From 1982 to 1993, Gilles worked at the DND Quality Engineering and Test Establishment (QETE) as the head of the Electrical Transients, Measurements and Calibration Systems laboratory.

Gilles holds a B.A.Sc. in Electrical Engineering and M.Sc. in Project Management. He is also a member of the Ordre des Ingénieurs du Québec.
